


Daniel easily outshone the leaders and administrators, so the King made plans to place him as ruler over all of them. This made the other leaders and administrators very jealous.

"Yes and this law cannot be changed!"




"Well," they grinned, "Daniel still prays to his God!"


He called out to Daniel, "May your God, whom you serve, save you". A stone was placed over the opening and it was sealed by the king and all the leaders.
