

God spoke to Moses in a 'burning' bush. He was to go to the new Pharaoh of Egypt and tell him, "Let God's people go!"



He said, "Let my people go!" and the Pharaoh again refused.


God sent a plague of frogs to cover all Egypt.

Then Moses said, "Let my people go!" Pharaoh's heart was hardened and he said "NO".


God sent a plague of gnats.

Moses would ask Pharaoh to "Let my people go" and Pharaoh would say "NO".


God sent a plague of flies.





God killed all the Egyptian's animals.


God sent a plague of boils on the Egyptian's skin.






God sent a plague of hail.
