

"I am not married! That can't be right?" Mary questioned.


"The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and this baby will be God's own Son. Nothing is impossible for God," the angel said.




Meanwhile, Caesar Augustus ordered a census to be taken throughout the entire Roman Empire.


Suddenly, a huge crowd of angels appeared singing, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours."




The Shepherds looked at each other and said, "What are we waiting for? Let's go and see what the Lord has revealed to us."

Luke 1:26-38


God sends an angel to tell Mary she will have a baby.
